THREE EVENTS, A MAJOR LEARNING OPPORTUNITY

Today, official statistics produces public goods that respond to the needs of many categories of users. It is our mission to make sure that we deliver the best products, at the lowest possible costs. In order to achieve this mission, it is critical to maintain the confidence of national and international users. However, there are many challenges that official statistics has to overcome.

The first is globalization. Our world has changed under the increasing interaction between companies, people and governments worldwide. It is the duty of the official statistics to capture this, new, complex reality that emerged.

The second challenge is the data revolution. Technology is shaping the future of our lives. With regard to official statistics, one must note that digital transformations across the globe offer new data sources that can significantly improve timeliness and relevance of our indicators. However, in order to harness these new data sources, it is vital for us to incorporate the latest IT tools into our production.

We considered all these aspects when we designed our programme for the Presidency. The three major events hosted by the Romanian National Institute of Statistics under the Romanian Presidency aimed at addressing these challenges.

The first event concerned the next population census. For each national institute census is a crucial milestone. Today we perform it using administrative sources and classic enumeration. However, we will, shortly have to use big data. Today it might be a dream but tomorrow it will be the reality. Following the conclusions of the conference, one might notice that European countries are ready to cooperate and exchange best practices so that the 2021 Census Round will be successful.

The second event concerning applying R in official statistics was organised together with our colleagues from the Netherlands. It was a great opportunity to enhance our cooperation with the academia.


The third event was dedicated to our users. We understood

POPULATION CENSUS, 2020 ROUND AND POST 2020 FROM TRADITIONS TO MODERNISM, 8-9 APRIL 2019



The two-day conference was a good opportunity for the specialists in the field to meet and share their experience gained with the occasion of the previous rounds of population census.

The novelties that will be experimented for the first time in the 2021 round were debated, considering that most EU countries are currently in an advanced stage of its preparation.

The event brought together about 100 professionals from Eurostat, Spain, Luxembourg, Austria, France, Estonia, Lithuania, Hungary and Romania.

The conference included five scientific sessions and a panel session. The sessions focused on the following themes:

- General strategies to conduct population censuses for 2021 round:
- Specific elements on drafting the national census legislative package;
- Organizational arrangements and good practices for a successful census promotion, including best practices for census promotion;
- New methods of organizing the collection and processing of census data such as the use of administrative sources or sample surveys;
- Using multi-modal methods for enumeration, such as the use of intelligent web forms and scanning questionnaires as methods of data entry into databases:
- Use of innovative technologies such as buildings Geo-referencing;

- Role of the post-enumeration survey and methods for correcting / improving the census results by applying the results of post enumeration survey and other census aspects;
- Technical aspects regarding the application of statistical methods for estimating certain indicators:
- Methods and ways to insure the data confidentiality (statistical disclosure control),
- Methods of organization and measures taken under the conditions of compliance with GDPR regulation etc.

All the keynote speakers joined together in the final panel session, to discuss about "Is there a need for population and housing census in the future and if so, how will it look like?".

Population is reluctant to statistical surveys.







As part of the activities within the year in which Romania is holding the EU Presidency, National Institute for Statistics of Romania has organized, in Bucharest, on April 8th — 9th 2019, the Conference on "Population Census, 2020 round and post 2020: from traditions to modernism".

The Conference was a good opportunity for the specialists to share their experience gained with the occasion of the previous rounds. It made room for interesting discussion on the novelties that will be experimented for the first time in the 2020–2021 round. Policy makers need faster and more detailed statistics from the censuses.

Population is more and more reluctant in participating to statistical surveys. Consequently, NSOs are facing challenges in preparing and organizing next population census in best way so that to overcome the difficulties already known as well as any new ones that may occur.

Conference debates have mainly concluded that:

- For 2021 round MSs will use different approaches some only administrative sources, others a combination of methods, but with focus on "digital census" where web questionnaire will play a major role
- Census promoting campaign has a crucial role and several were ideas were expressed for motivating population to self-register; a successful promoting campaign has to be flexible, dynamic, customized;
- Geocoded data (GIS) have an increasing role and the users are strongly requested it.

Quality is very important in all steps.

Many countries face demands for more frequent, timely, flexible and geographically detailed population statistics. National statistical institutes are constrained though by resource limitations and declining public compliance with traditional data collection methods.

An increased use of administrative data sources is widely seen as the solution. Countries differ greatly in terms of data source availability and in how these sources will be used.

The International Conference Use of R in Official Statistics - uRos2019 was the seventh of a series of events, organised at Romanian National Institute of Statistics, dedicated to the use of R Project in Romanian official statistics, as well as of the software that integrates the packages and functions of R.

This year, the uRos conference was organized under the aegis of the Presidency of the Council of the European Union.

The purpose of the conference is to provide a public forum where academics and statistical institutes they represent can exchange ideas and discuss the evolution of software commonly used in the economy and applied statistics.

The conference took place between May 20-21, 2019 and brought together 105 participants from 30 countries, statisticians and specialists from the statistical offices and academia and representatives of international organizations that produce official statistics (International Labor Organization and Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations).

As every year, the conference was coordinated by Nicoleta Caragea, senior expert at the National Institute of Statistics, Department of Population and External Migration Statistics and Associate Professor at the Faculty of Economics, Ecological University of Bucharest.

The conference was attended by two keynote speakers - two of the most wellknown R community experts. Julie Josse is a member of RFoundation and Rforwards, and Professor of Statistics at Ecole Polytechnique in France, and presented "A missing value tour in R ". Giulio Barcaroli, expert of the Institute of Statistics of Italy between 1977 and 2018, presented the twenty-year history of R in Istat.

The conference included one day of tutorial sessions, one day of scientific sessions and one day dedicated to un-Conf satellite event.

The five tutorials lectured by prestigious professionals from the R community were as follows:

1. Statistical data cleaning for

official statistics with R

Lecturers: Edwin de Jonge and Mark van der Loo (CBS, Olanda)

2. Modern package development in R

Lecturers: Alexander Kowarik and Bernhard Meindl (Statistics Austria)

3. Use of R package Sampling Strata for the **Optimal Stratification** of Sampling **Frames** for Multipurpose **Sampling Surveys**

Lecturers: Marco Ballin and Giulio Barcaroli, Italian National Institute of Statistics (Istat)

4. Integration of data sources in R through statistical matching

Lecturer: Marcello D'Orazio (Istat & Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN)

The conference included the following parallel sessions: Sampling and estimation, R in organization, Data cleaning, R in production: data analysis, Methods for official statistics, Shiny applications, Time series, Report and GUI programming, R in production: automation, Big data și Dissemination and visualization.

They focused on the following themes:

- Examples of applying R in statistical production.
- Examples of applying R in dissemination of statistics (visualisation, apps, reporting).
- Analyses of big data and/or application of machine learning for official statistics.
- R packages implementing statistical methodology
- R packages connecting R to other standard tools/technical standards
- Organisational and technical

aspects of introducing R to the statistical office.

Examples of accessing or using official statistics publications with R in other fields

A hackaton satellite event, called unConf, took place at the end of the uRos2019 conference. Five international teams of statisticians from around the world, who developed software products with direct applicability in official statistics, participated in the event.

Starting this year, the conference has a dedicated logo that can be updated every year and aligns with the R community standards: A maximum of ten selected research papers will be published in a special issue of the Romanian Statistical Review and additionally a maximum of five papers will be published in a special issue of Austrian Journal of Statistics.

Quality of the works presented, high research activity carried out by the authors, and the results may be as many strong points of reference, to conclude that Romania is on the map of useRs. uRos2020 will be held in Vienna (Austria), and will be organized by Statistics Austria.


Informal conversations in the conference are precious help to find a way and needless to say about the formal speeches and presentations.



What do conferences organizers say?

The National Statistics Institute of Romania, holding the Presidency of the EU Council Working Party on Statistics, demonstrated that it could assume the role of an honest and neutral mediator, taking over the responsibility for advancing the work of the Council on EU legislation, ensuring the continuity of the EU agenda, well-organized legislative processes and cooperation between Member States.

We have thus succeeded in closing two important files of statistics: " Proposal for a REGULATION OF THE EUROPEAN PAR-LIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL on European business statistics amending Regulation (EC) No 184/2005 and repealing 10 legal acts in the field of business statistics, (Proposal for a FRIBS Regulation) and the Proposal for a REGULATION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL establishing a common framework for European statistics relating to persons and households, based on data at individual level collected from samples (the IESS Regulation proposal) ", also making progress on the migration and international protection statistics file.

PRES RO also had an important mission to organize in Bucharest, on the premises of the National Institute of Statistics, three international conferences on highly topical issues for the European and international agenda with a large and extremely selective participation.

- 1. "Population Census Conference: Round 2020 and post 2020 — From Traditions to Modernism" (April 2019)
- 2. "The Use of R in Official Statistics uRos2019" (May)
- 3. " National Conference of statistical data users" (June)
