Existent livestock on December 1, 2008

Based on the results of statistical survey on livestock and animal production in 2008, carried out by the National Institute of Statistics on December 1, 2008, as against the same date of 2007, livestock of cattle and pigs registered falls, while livestock of sheep, goats and poultry increased.

December 1, 2008 as compared to December 1, 2007

Total cattle on December 1, 2008 point out a fall by 4.8 %, while womb livestock (milk cows, reproduction buffalo cows and reproduction heifers), also decreased by 5.4 %.

Total pigs decreased by 6.0 %, while womb livestock (breeding sows) decreased by 14.9 %.

Total sheep and goats is increasing by 4.8 %, while womb livestock (sheep, ewes and goats) increased by 5.3 %.

Total poultry registered a growth of 2.8 %, while laying poultry increased by 0.7 %.

The decrease in cattle and pigs livestock in 2008 was especially determined by unfavorable climate conditions in 2007, being a very weak year in the crop sector, causing the fall of fodder production and implicitly the growth of slaughtered livestock.

After successive increases in the cattle and pigs livestock, reaching at end of 2006 about 3 million heads cattle, respectively over 6.8 million pigs, constantly followed significant falls in 2007 and 2008, for both species.

For pigs livestock, Romania holds the tenth place among European Union countries, after France, Germany, United Kingdom, Spain, Italy, Ireland, Poland and Netherlands. Regarding the number of animals per 100 ha land, our country is among the last countries, being followed by Bulgaria and Hungary.

For pigs livestock at the end of the year, Romania holds the ninth in the European Union, after: Germany, Spain, France, Poland, Denmark, Netherlands, Italy and Belgium. From the viewpoint of density per 100 ha land, our country is followed by countries such as: Finland, Slovakia, Lithuania, Greece and Bulgaria.

At end of the year, for sheep and goats livestock, Romania holds the fourth place among Member States, after Spain, United Kingdom. Regarding animals per 100 ha land, our country is placed after Greece, United Kingdom, Portugal, Spain, Netherlands, Italy and Ireland.

Methodological note

The information presented result from the statistical survey regarding livestock and animal production in 2008, carried out by the National Institute of Statistics. This survey was done based on a sample representative at national level, regions of development and counties. The sample volume was 59610 agricultural holdings, of which 2562 agricultural holdings with legal status and 57048 individual agricultural holdings. The confidence interval was 95% (error margin ±2%).
