Livestock existent on December 1, 2009

To have a correct interpretation of results, kindly consult the methodological notes on page 3 in the press release

Based on the results of *statistical survey on livestock and animal production in 2009*, carried out by National Institute of Statistics, on December 1, 2009, as compared to the same date of 2008, cattle, pigs livestock and poultry registered falls, while sheep and goats livestock increased.

December 1, 2009 as compared to December 1, 2008

Total number of cattle on December 1, 2009 points out a fall with 6.4 %, and womb livestock (see for milk, buffalo cows for reproduction and heifers for reproduction), also decreased with 4.3 %.

Total number of pigs decreased by 6.2 % and womb livestock (breeding sows) decreased by 4.5 %.

Total number of sheep and goats is increasing by 2.9 % and womb livestock (sheep, ewes, goats) increased by 2.8 %.

Total number of poultry registered a fall of 0.6 % and layers decreased by 1.1 %.

After successive growths of cattle and pigs livestock, reaching at the end of 2006 about 3 million heads of cattle, respectively over 6.8 million pigs, there followed constantly significant falls in 2007, 2008 and 2009, for both species.

For pigs livestock at the end of the year, Romania holds the eight place in the European Union, after Germany, Spain, France, Poland, Denmark, Netherlands and Italy. From the viewpoint of density per 100 ha land, our country is followed by the countries such as: Finland, Slovakia, Lithuania, Greece and Bulgaria.

Note: For Czech Republic, Denmark, Ireland and Finland data for 2008 were used for sheep and goats livestock.

At the end of the year, for sheep and goats livestock, Romania holds the fourth place among Member States, after Spain, United Kingdom and Greece. Regarding the density per $100~\mathrm{ha}$ land, our country is after Greece, Spain, United Kingdom, Portugal, Italy and Netherlands.

Methodological notes

1) Data source is Yearly Statistical Survey (YSS), regarding livestock and animal production in 2009, according to the Regulation of European Parliament and of the Council no. 1165/2008/EC regarding the statistics on livestock and meat.

Statistical survey comprises all the variables on livestock by species, age groups and weight categories existent on December 1. Statistical sampling survey addressed a representative sample of 60016 agricultural holdings, of which 2428 agricultural holdings with legal personality and 57588 individual agricultural holdings. The confidence interval was 95% (error margin ±2%). Cattle, sheep and goats livestock were reported per arable area + pastures + hayfields and pigs livestock per arable area. For Bulgaria, France, Poland, Italy and Ireland there were used data regarding arable area in 2008 and for Greece and Denmark, data from 2007. For Bulgaria, Italy, France and Ireland, there were used data regarding areas of pastures and hayfields from 2008 and for Greece and Denmark data from 2007.

2) Concepts and definitions

Term "livestock"

- **2.1** "cattle" mean creatures of the species *Bos taurus* and *Bubalus bubalis* as well as hybrids as *Beefalo*;
- 2.2 "pigs" mean creatures of the species Sus scrofa Domesticus;
- 2.3 "sheep" mean creatures of the species Ovis aries;
- **2.4** "goats" mean creatures of the subspecies Capra aegagrus hircus;
- **2.5** "poultry" mean creatures of the species *Gallus gallus* (chicken), *Meleagris spp.* (turkey), *Anas spp.* and *Cairina moschata* (ducks) and *Anser anser dom.* (geese). This category includes creatures of the species *Coturnix spp.* (qual), *Phasianus spp.* (pheasanti), *Numida meleadgris dom.* (guinea hen) and *Struthio camelus* (ostrich). Nevertheless, this category does not include poultry bred in captivity for hunt purposes and which are not meant for meat production.
