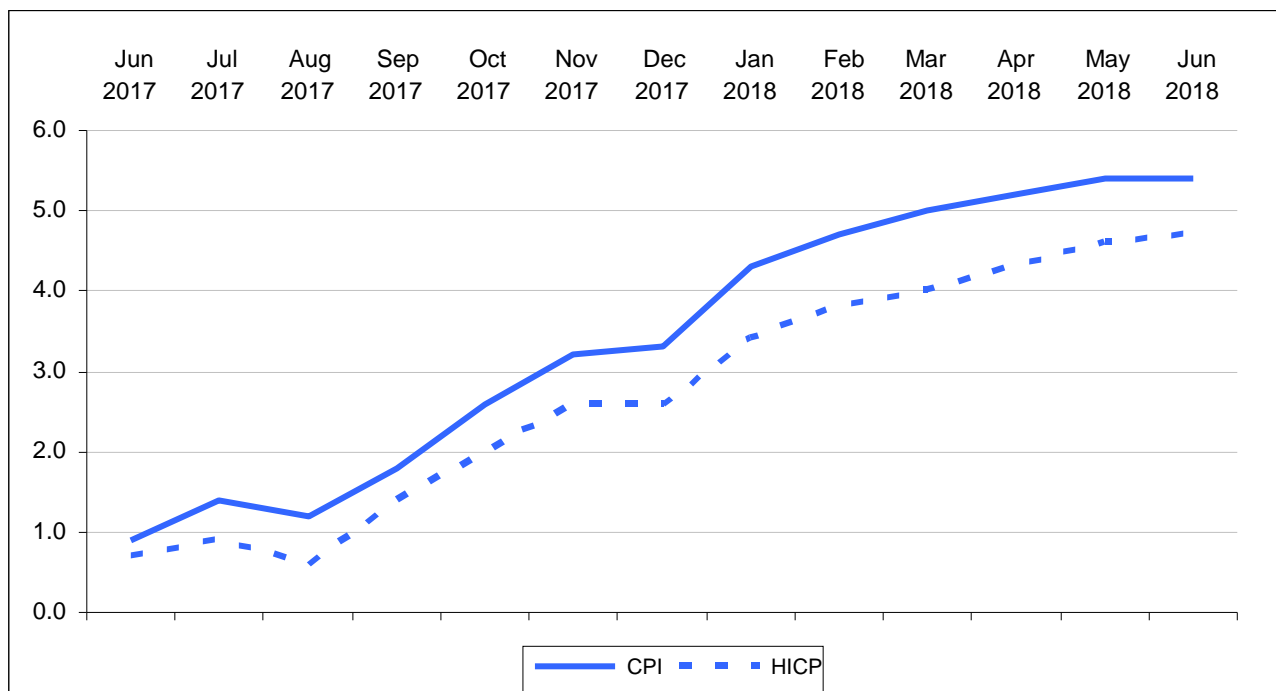


**Domain: Consumer prices**

**THE EVOLUTION OF CONSUMER PRICES IN JUNE 2018**

- Consumer prices were up 5.4% in June 2018 compared to June 2017. The annual rate calculated on the basis of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) is 4.7%.
- The average inflation rate based on the CPI over the last 12 months (July 2017-June 2018) as compared to the previous 12 months (July 2016-June 2017) is 3.6%. The average rate based on the HICP is 2.9%.
